Payment Schedule

A \$750.00 per person is due with your reservation. A second payment of \$750.00 is due on March 30th. A third payment of \$750.00 is due on April 30th 2017, final payment is due on May 15th, 2017. Please make all checks/money orders payable to Winzer Stube European Adventures Tours. All personal checks, money orders or cashier's checks will be deposited upon receipt; Any late payments and returned checks will result in a \$ 25.00 fee. In the interest of keeping tour costs as low as possible, we do not accept credit cards.

Cancellation Policy

All cancellations must be in writing. No cancellations will be accepted over the phone.

After enrollment, should you decide to cancel at any time up until April 5th, 2017 there will be a \$100.00 administration fee. The cancellation penalty after July 1st 2017 no refund is possible.

Tour Price

Tour price is based on the cost of accommodations, admissions and the value of the dollar as of January 1st, 2017 and is subject to change reflecting the dollar's value. We reserve the right to assess surcharges such as airline imposed fuel surcharges whenever they are announced.

Lake Balaton is a freshwater lake in western Hungary. It's a major holiday destination with beaches, volcanic hills, resort towns and high-rise hotels along its 197km shoreline. The hilly north shore is a wine-growing region, with protected wetlands and hiking trails at Balaton Uplands National Park. The town of Veszprém has a walled castle district, and 13th-century frescoes at the Gizella Chapel. Schloss Esterházy is a palace in Eisenstadt, Austria, the capital of the Burgenland state. It was constructed in the late 13th century, and came under ownership of the Hungarian Esterházy family in 1622.

Apart from being regarded as the *City of Music* because of its musical legacy, Vienna is also said to be "The City of Dreams" because it was home to the world's first psycho-analyst – [Sigmund Freud](#). The city's roots lie in early [Celtic](#) and [Roman](#) settlements that transformed into a [Medieval](#) and [Baroque](#) city, and then the capital of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. It is well known for having played an essential role as a leading European music centre, from the great age of Viennese Classicism through the early part of the 20th century. The historic centre of Vienna is rich in architectural ensembles, including Baroque castles and gardens, and the late-19th-century Ringstraße lined with grand buildings, monuments and parks.

The Danube is Europe's second-longest river, after the Volga River, and also the longest river in the European Union region. It is located in Central and Eastern Europe.
